TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS

All of the resources described below provide the user with the law and procedures and, in some instances, sample forms that will enable them to research their traffic court issues.

- Most non-criminal traffic infractions will fall under either Florida Statutes 316 or 318. This will depend on the specific violation for which the citation is issued. The ticket should name the specific statute violated.
- VCLL has several excellent resources that will assist library users in their research of traffic infraction issues.
- The Florida Traffic and DUI Practice Manual is a three (3) volume set published by LEXIS that provides comprehensive information on this topic. This set also has the current Florida traffic statutes (laws).
- Another resource is Florida Traffic Ticket Defense, published by Revere Legal Publishers. This resource has an excellent outline on court procedures and includes sample forms that may be used to create pleadings for submission to traffic court.
- VCLL has treatises that will assist the library users with researching DUI issues:
 - A. Florida DUI Defense, published by Revere Legal Publishers.
 - B. Drunk Driving Defense, published by Aspen Legal Publishers.
 - C. Florida Traffic and DUI Practice Manual, described in paragraph 3 above.
 - D. Florida DUI Handbook, published by Thomson West Legal Publishers.

Unless otherwise directed, all notices of court appearances, communications (orders, etc.) and/or summonses will be sent via U.S. mail to the address on the citation.
